ell here we are again, another new month full of opportunities to gather together and ride. With that in mind, I'll run through the list of rides and follow up with a recap of our world-class trip to Americade and the east coast.

We start the first day of the month early with a breakfast ride to the Southern Belle's Restaurant in Barrington. This new restaurant for us has a menu item called BoNuts. What are they, you might ask? Kickstands up at 8:45 as we ride out there to find out! Then the next weekend Craig will lead us on a dinner ride on July 8th. At this point it is a mystery ride as he has not revealed the location! I'm thinking Mexican?! Two weeks later we'll have an awesome time exploring the backroads of Baraboo on Tim's all-day ride called Devil's Run, but only after a lakeside lunch and a ferry crossing! The last weekend of the month will find us in southern Illinois in a place called Vandalia. Our IL District Rally will offer your choice of a ride to the infamous Moonshine Restaurant or Giant City State Park and Bald Knob. There will also be a 50/50 raffle, games, a light show, and of course ICE CREAM. JT, Ellary, and I went there last year and had a blast.

In August we have a breakfast ride on Saturday the 5th with a location to be determined. The following Saturday is the annual Dinner Ride to the Prime Quarter in Janesville. Ellary will show us the way. We have the EWMA Region E Ride In coming up August 17-19 in La Crosse WI. There will be guided rides, prizes, and a 50/50 raffle The room rate block is good until July 16th and if you pre-register for the Ride In by July 16, admission is free. Gary Cueno is hosting the annual picnic August 27th in lieu of the August meeting.

In the beginning of the year Gary Cueno, Gary Wanke and I talked about planning a small trip for a few people to Americade for a few days. As we met and discussed all the places we wanted to go we realized that several of the places were on the bucket list of many of our members. So we shared our ideas at our monthly gathering. At first some said they could only make the Rally and then they'd have to return home. As time progressed we found we had seven people who were committed to being on the road for thirteen days and wanted to experience Americade and a tour of the east coast. So we set off at 7:30 am on Memorial Day and headed east. After a day of rapid travel on the interstate we slowed things way down with a magnificent ride through Letchworth State Park led by Gary Wanke. At first the road reminded us a lot of the Blue Ridge Parkway until we started to reach the canyons. Gary said this is known as the "Grand Canyon of the East" and proceeded to show us not one, but three different waterfalls that help the Genesee River run through the gorge.

Then it was on to Americade in Lake George, NY. We took a guided ride to Lake Placid and got to stand on the podiums that were used at the Olympics. We couldn't decide who came in first so we took many pictures with each of us holding down the first place spot. After a day touring Americade we relaxed on a boat cruise across Lake George complete with dinner and a band. The next day Gary Cueno took the reins and led us through Vermont and onto the Kancamagus Scenic Byway in New Hampshire. He led like a king and took us through the serpentine byway several of us had never been on before. Fantastic job Gary!

After stopping in Kennebunkport, ME for some lobster rolls we moved on to Beantown where Steve and I enjoyed a Red Sox game at Fenway Park while the others took an excellent tour of Boston. June 25 Meeting Minutes

hapter Director Ellary Kahan called the June monthly chapter meeting to order at 9:30 am. The meeting was attended by Andy Toth, Bob Manion, David Bierman, Ed Harms, Ellary Kahan, Gary Cueno, Jeff Schmidt, Jim (J.T.) Thomas, Mark Muhlenfeld, Tony Valicenti, and Warren Randall.

Tim McGuire gave us a tri-fold brochure which was developed by Minnesota Eagle Wings Chapter W, Buffalo, MN and said that the chapter gives these out to prospective members at various meetings and other locations and contains a QR code which, when scanned, opens the EWMA website with an application. Tim thought that this was something to consider to inform and recruit new EW-MA members. The group agreed that this is something to develop for G2.

Because Greg Natenberg did not attend the meeting, his "consecutive ride to G2 meetings" run ended at three. Not a bad record.

Gary gave a recap of the very successful thirteen-day Americade trip. David remarked that the extremely well-designed trip was loaded with interesting sights and attractions, and Gary and his wing men, Gary Wanke and Tim McGuire, booked hotel reservations and researched and modified the restaurant arrangements as needed. He wanted to thank them for their in-depth planning and execution of a great ride for all. Details of the trip will be described in the Rides Section of this newsletter.

Education Report

<u>Intersections</u> - David pointed out that whether driving a car or a motorcycle, our roads are getting more and more dangerous. Some of the causes are driver distractions and the ignoring of the basic Rules of the Road, which are not being enforced by police as they once were. Speeding and running through red lights are all too common. At intersections, if the light is changing, it is far safer to wait, instead of proceeding and possibly encountering a driver running the light. Make sure to look in all directions before moving into any intersection to watch for any possible risks or for aggressive or distracted drivers.

<u>Rider Seat Positioning</u> - In general, we tend to sit relaxed with our backs against our backrests or the raised part of the seat cushion. While this positioning is comfortable, there are times that call for a better seat position to have more control of your motorcycle. During low-speed maneuvering or quick changes of direction, i.e., turns at intersections or tight set of curves, the better seat position is to move up and forward, sitting right at the front of your seat and up against the gas tank. Upright and over the handlebars gives you much better balance and control of your motorcycle. If you ever watch videos of police in parking lot courses, you will see them sitting in this seat position for better control and balance of their motorcycles.

Finally, Gary said that the August 27 picnic site had been reserved and that he will confer with Craig and Lonnie as the date approached.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 am and David led seven riders on a great ride to Woodstock. Until we meet again, take good care of yourself and your family and friends, stay healthy and be safe.

The Good Book Guide

osie Gamble, her sixteen year old son Drew and fourteen year old daughter Keira, were living with Stuart Kofer. Stu was a well respected member of the Ford county sheriff's department. But he was a mean drunk who frequently went out drinking with his buddies then would come home and abuse Josie and the kids. Josie was indigent and otherwise homeless, which is why she stayed with Stu. One night he came home so drunk that his BAL was 0.36. He punched Josie in the face, breaking her jaw in two places and knocking her out. Then he went upstairs to his bedroom and passed out. The kids thought their mother was dead. Drew went to Stu's room, took his service revolver and pointed it an inch or so from Stu's head and pulled the trigger.

In John Grisham's *A Time For Mercy*, Jake Brigance is chosen by Judge Noose to represent Drew, who is being tried as an adult and is charged with capital murder. He is reluctant to take the case since state law limits his fee to \$1000, which certainly won't cover his costs for a defense. But he's stuck with it. And he has to deal with the Kofer family and all the other sheriff's deputies who are out for blood. So he has to put his career, financial security and safety of his family on the line. The facts are not in dispute so Jake's goal is to save the boy's life.

There are plot twists, small town intrigue and courthouse scheming making this another excellent story from the master of legal thrillers. How would you vote if you were on Drew's jury?



I'm back to reading John Grisham's Theodore Boone series, about a thirteen year old son of lawyers who does some of his own lawyering. In The Abduction, Theo's best friend and fellow classmate, April Finnemore, goes missing. Her father and mother are seldom together. Her father often goes off for days to tour with his band, often without telling anyone he's leaving. Her mother is a neglectful hippie. The theory is that April's cousin, the notorious criminal Jack Leeper, has abducted her. The authorities, stuck on that, are failing to make any progress. So it's up to Theo, with his uncle Ike's help, to find her.

In *The Accused*, it's Theo who has to exonerate himself. A local electronics store was robbed around the same time that Theo was riding his bike in the vicinity. When some stolen goods are found in his locker, Theo becomes the prime suspect. We know he didn't do it. But how is he going to prove it.

These are very short novels, less than 175 pages, and obviously meant for young readers. But they are well written with many plot twists so adults can enjoy them too.
