The Good Book Guide

aniel Silva's *The Kill Artist* (2000) is the f rst installment in the acclaimed *Gabriel Allon* series, introducing readers to the enigmatic art restorer and former Israeli intelligence operative. This novel lays the foundation for a character-driven espionage saga f lled with intrigue, moral dilemmas, and the burdens of a violent past.
